

Outline of Oral Presentation Programme of the Fifth World Landslide Forum

The Fifth World Landslide Forum (WLF5) will be held at the National Kyoto International Conference Center (KICC) in Kyoto, Japan on 2-6 November 2021 after a postponement of a year from the initially scheduled date of 2-6 November 2020 due to COVID-19 pandemic. Considering the effects of COVID-19, the WLF5 will be a hybrid conference (onsite, online-virtual or pre-recorded oral presentations). WLF5 secretariat asked all oral presentation speakers to select the mode of presentation they prefer by 31 March 2021. The change in presentation mode can be accepted by 15 September 2021.

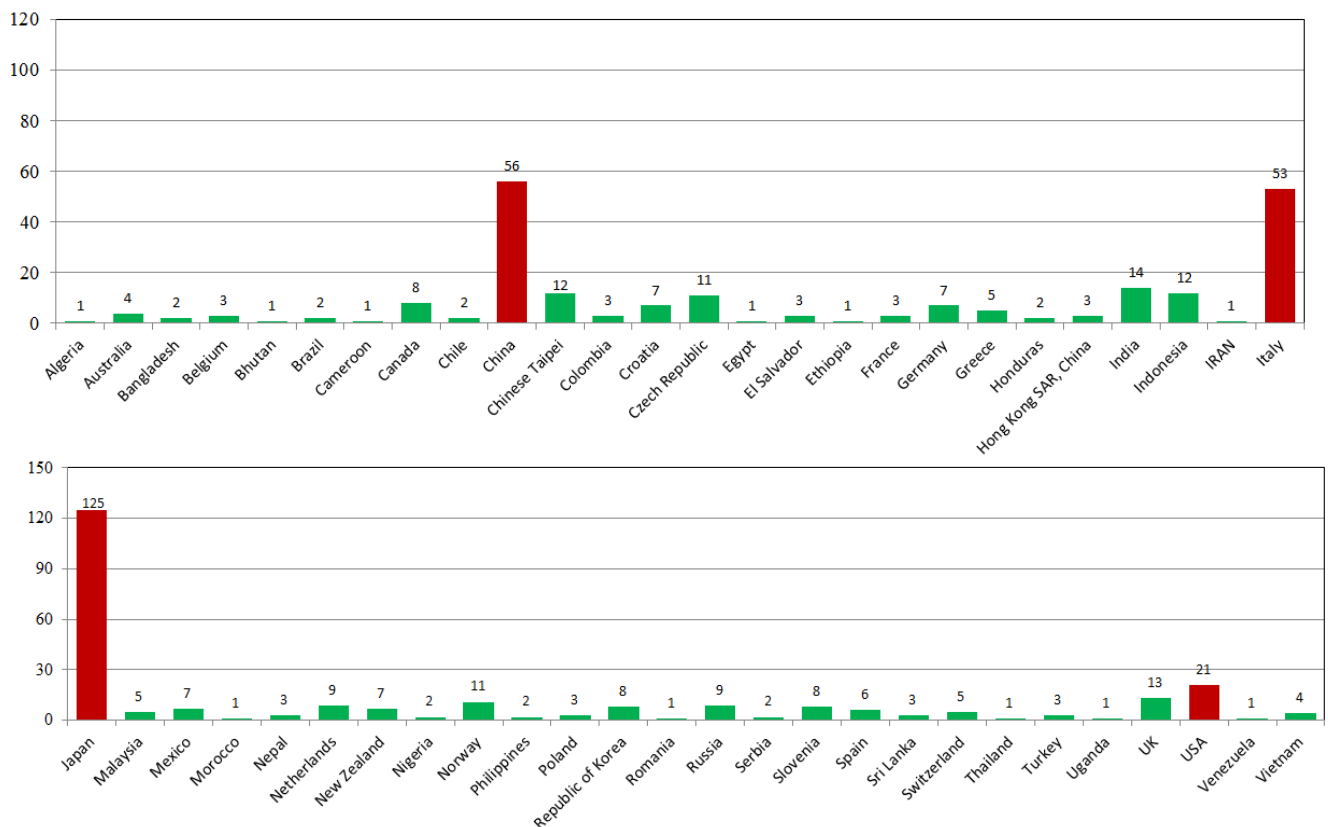


Figure 1 presents the country-specific numbers of oral presentation speakers. Total 479 Speakers from 52 Countries/Regions have registered - 125 from Japan, 56 from China, 53 from Italy, 21 from USA, 14 from India, 13 from UK, 12 from Indonesia and Chinese Taipei, and 11 from Czech Republic and Norway. The number of onsite speakers is 240 and numbers of online speakers and undecided are 159 and 80, respectively.

Number of speakers in each theme or session:

Plenary Session: Forum lectures and Award lectures (6), Theme 1: Sendai Landslide Partnerships and Kyoto Landslide Commitment (69), Theme 2: From Mapping to Hazard and Risk Zonation (81), Theme 3 : Monitoring and Early Warning (65), Theme 4: Testing, Modeling and Risk Assessment (63), Theme 5: Catastrophic Landslides and Frontiers of Landslide Science (62), Theme 6: Specific Topics in Landslide Science and Applications (57), Thematic Issue Session (9), The Japan Landslide Society Session (51), and World Tsunami Awareness Day Session (16). The Kyoto Landslide Commitments 2020

The Kyoto 2020 Commitment for Global Promotion of Understanding and Reducing Landslide Disaster Risk (Kyoto Landslide Commitment 2020: KLC2020): A Commitment to the Sendai Landslide Partnerships 2015–2025, the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction 2015–2030, the 2030 Agenda Sustainable Development Goals, the New Urban Agenda and the Paris Climate Agreement was launched on 5 November 2020.

The High-level Panel Discussion “KLC2020 review and way forward” will be organized in the morning of 3 November 2021 immediately after the opening addresses by ICL, ICL supporting organizations, and host organizations. Major outputs of the high-level panel discussion are now being examined. The KLC2020 secretariat is now conducting pre-examination to create a new open-access platform to disseminate information of the recent progress in landslide research and technology to all people who cannot access Landslides: Journal of the International Consortium on Landslides.

This process is still at the planning stage. The current concept is to create an open access book series “Progress in Landslide Research and Technology” to provide a common platform for the publication on recent progress in landslide research and technology with a focus on practical applications and the benefit for the society contributing to the Kyoto Landslide Commitment 2020, which is expected to continue up to 2030 and even

beyond to globally promote the understanding and reduction of landslide disaster risk, as well as to address the 2030 Agenda Sustainable Development Goals.
